CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Faith in the midst of fear

“. . . and the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left.” – Exodus 14:22

We can all picture the image from Cecil B DeMille's epic film, "The Ten Commandments," the Israelites walking down the embankment between two massive walls of water. Yet, in the midst of that incredible miracle of God, every one of those men, women, and children were living somewhere between fear and terror. Here they were praying for decade upon a decade for their slavery and oppression to the Egyptians to cease, for God to hear their cries and save them. Now they are forced to walk between two towering walls of water or face the sword of the Egyptians bearing down on them from behind.

Where's the miracle God? What in the world are you up to? What kind of a rescue is this? God could certainly have kept the army back, softening Pharaoh's heart, keeping the army in Egypt while the Israelites coasted into the promised land. But what they couldn't see with human eyes was the miracle that God was about to perform.

How often in life do we pray and pray all while grumbling and complaining when God guides our lives in unexpected ways. "What kind of rescue is this?" we ask. The answer is. . . God's perfect will!

We are told to walk by faith and not by sight. The Israelites could not "see" the entirety of the miracle while they were in the middle of living through it. So, even in the midst of a trial, you cannot see the miracle that God has in store for you, and is most likely performing on you this very moment!

Prayer:

Lord, even when all seems hopeless, you are there working your miracle – maybe not in my timing, but always in your timing, which is perfect. Deepen my faith so that when I feel alone, trying to fix things imperfectly in my own strength, I will call upon you. Help me to know that you are always with me and ahead of me clearing a path to a future filled with hope and abundant life. Amen.

Name an obstacle in your life – a person, a situation, a concern – that feels unmovable. What about this obstacle seems impossible to move on our own strength? Give the Impossible to God through prayer and watch what happens!

DEACONATE ORDINATION

On April 24th the Archdiocese ordained 36 men to the order of Diaconate, with 33 permanent Deacons and 3 transitional Deacons. At the ordination the Archbishop prays over each candidate as he is given the Evangeliary (the book that contains the Gospels): "Receive the book of the gospel whose herald you have become. Believe what you read. Teach what you believe. Practice what you teach." - does not this apply to all of us to mirror the universal call to holiness that Christ asks us? Please pray for our new Deacons, for their continued ministry to our Church and for their faithfulness.

Our own Deacon Dan Hess, intern at St Albert the Great, was ordained as a transitional deacon on his way into the priesthood. A reception luncheon was held at Incarnation Parish Center after the ordination program for the transitional deacons, families and friends. Bishop Schnurr led the blessing over the food. Our Council (along with other Dayton councils) provided monetary support for this event. Thanks to Steve Timmer, Bob Burns, Jim Duffin and Bob Erhart for providing manpower for this event

YOUTH MINISTRY AWARD

For over 25 years, the Dayton Serra Club and the Greater Dayton Knights of Columbus have cosponsored a program to recognize youth serving in our local parishes in the great Dayton area requesting nominees in grades 6-12 that are doing extraordinary ministry work in their parish. On April 22, 2010 over 150 young people received a rosary, medal and certificate in recognition for their work. These are the leaders of Catholic Church and we thank them for their work. Also in attendance were over 400 parents and friends who shared in a reception in the basement of Immaculate Conception Church in Dayton after the formal program.

Each year a guest speaker conducts a talk about vocations, ministry to the Church and the appreciation of young people living the Gospels that our Church wishes us to lead. This year, Fr. Dave Endres gave a great talk on the need for vocations whether single, married, consecrated life and the need for prayer life in asking God to help discern that vocation. Bishop Schnurr has been asked to be the speaker for 2011.

Fr. Jim Manning, Fr. Combs, and Fr. Brinkmoeller were also in attendance. Our Council along with other Dayton Councils, provided monetary support to this program. The Knight of Columbus Fourth Degree Honor Guard led the procession into and out of the formal program

GOOD SHEPERD MINISTRIES

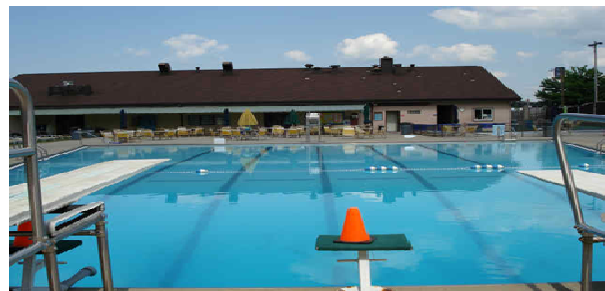

WHAT IS A GUARENTEED VALUE?

In most any life insurance policy, there exists a page containing a table of guaranteed values. To most people it might as well be Greek or Chinese! It is however, very sensible, and a testament to its flexibility. You have options if you run into trouble! There is a cash value, which is the value for which you can surrender (sell it back to the insurance company) or the amount for which you can obtain a loan, or paid up insurance, the reduced amount of insurance you keep if you quit paying premiums, or extended term, listed in years and days, which is the amount of time for which you still have the full amount of coverage if you stop paying premiums.
