GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT

With the passing of summer, the number of opportunities to obtain the higher Degrees of the Order has also increased. If you have not yet taken one of the higher degrees of the Order, please consider doing so as soon as possible. To attend, contact the listed point of contact to reserve your place and bring your current membership card.

The time listed for the Candidate Call is the time by which the Degree Team wants you at the designated location, signed in and prepared to take the Degree.

For those Exemplifications that will be for both the First and Second Degrees you, as a First Degree member, have two options. You can be at the designated location by the posted Candidate Call time and attend the First Degree as a member and then take the Second Degree along with the new First Degree members. Otherwise, show up at the designated location approximately 30 minutes after the posted First Degree Candidate Call time and then take the Second Degree along with the new First Degree members.

If you are the sponsor for a new member, do not allow them to go to any of the Degrees alone. Pick them up and take them to the Degree. Accompany them to their First Degree and encourage them to obtain their Second and Third Degrees.

If you have not attended a Degree since your own, I encourage you to attend one soon. You will get more out of the Exemplification when you can attend as a member.

Take a moment to check out your membership card. The degree shown comes from your records obtained from the Supreme database. Is the proper Degree level you have taken properly reflected? If not please notify the Financial Secretary so any corrections can be made.

The winners in the various age categories are eligible to participate in the District competition to be held at a later date. These winners are as follows:



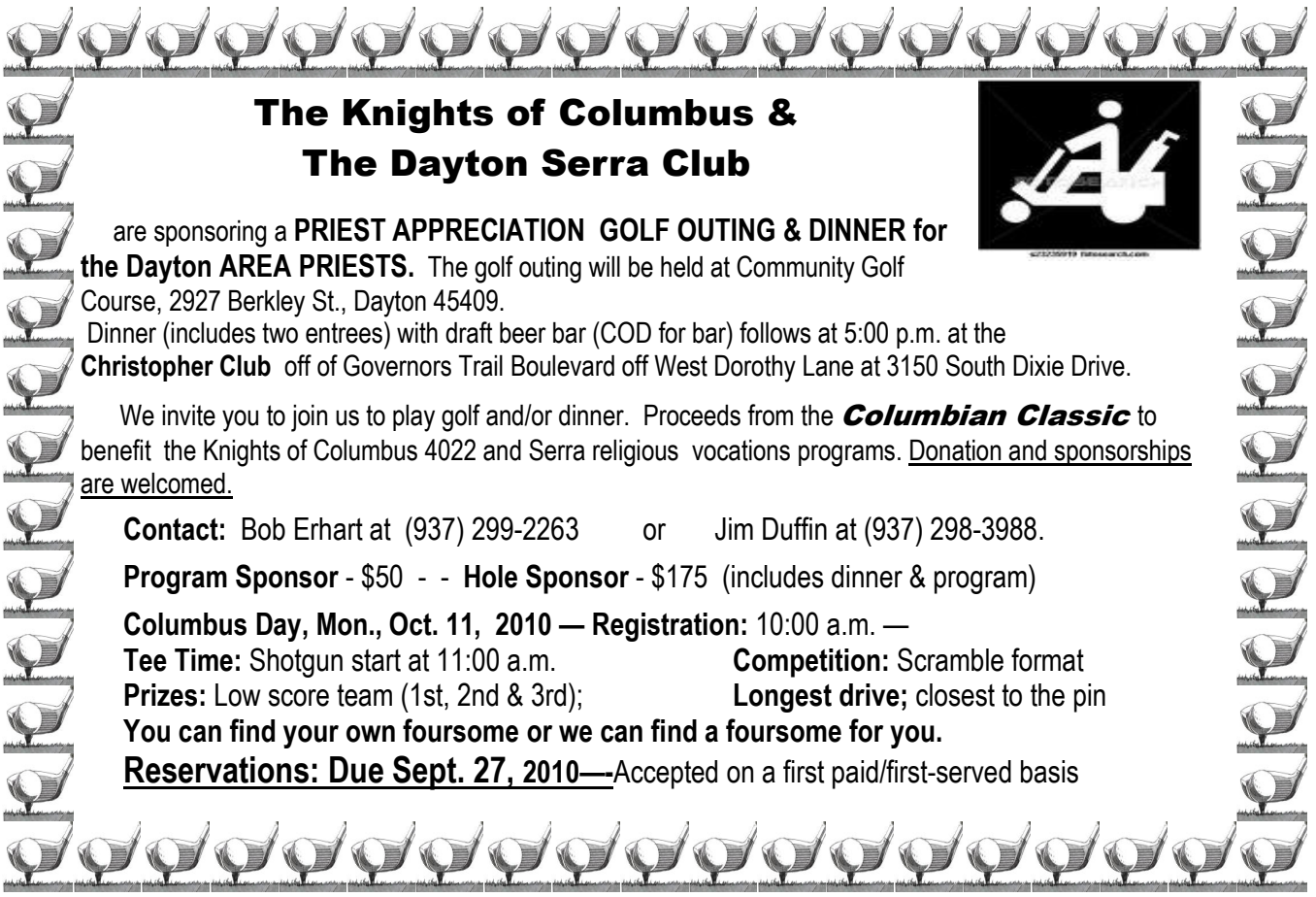

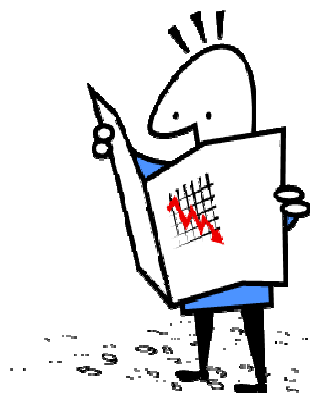
