**Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus
110th Ohio State Convention**

May 22-24, 2009
at the Millennium Hotel in Cincinnati.

Forst Elliot, David Cook and Bob Burns attended. Forst and David served as delegates and Bob was an alternate.

Before the convention actually got under way the Monsignor Krispinski Golf Tournament was held at the Glenview Golf Course. This is a Cincinnati Municipal course and was very challenging.

On Friday evening they held "A Nite at the Races" and drew for the winning tickets for the Super Cash Bonanza.

On Saturday morning they passed out various awards earned during past year by both Councils and individuals throughout the state. Council 4022 won an award for our Surge with Service program.

During the Saturday afternoon business meeting there were several items on the agenda:

There was the election of a new slate of State Officers. All officers ran unopposed. The current slate of State Officers basically moved up one chair leaving the State Warden's position open.

The most significant of these was the election of Paul Upman as the new State Deputy. The new slate of officers will be installed on 1 July.

Reports of the various committees were presented and adopted.

There were 19 resolutions presented to the convention for adoption. These ranged from recognition of individuals for service to the K of C to support for right-to-life actives. 16 of the 19 resolutions were adopted.

Caucuses were held to elect delegates to the Supreme Convention which will be held in Phoenix AZ on 4-6 August. Doug Sabo was elected as the delegate for Area 5.

The State Deputy's Banquet held on Saturday evening. During this evening the top Councils and individuals in the state were recognized.

- Fr. Richard Friebel was honored as the Chaplain of the Year. Fr. Friebel is the Chaplain for Council 500 in Dayton.
- Ms. Lacey Elizabeth Engle was honored as the Youth of the Year. Ms. Engle was nominated by Council 3742 in Fairborn.

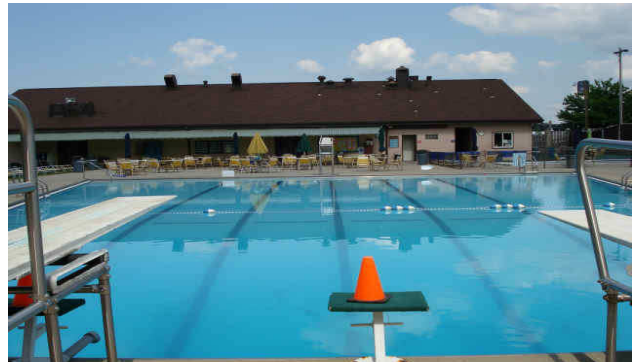
